1. Which aspect of this passage did you feel most challenged by reading?
2. Do you agree that in this text Jesus is primarily addressing the responsibility we have for Christians in need, rather than all needs? How do we practically navigate the tension here? (Galatians 6.10)
3. When we see some Christians **not** living such generous lives, and some non-Christians being **more** generous, how do we reconcile this with our understanding of the gospel?
4. (Discuss in pairs first) How can we better encourage one another to practically grow in our service to those in need? What concrete steps can you take to reflect the love of Jesus in action?
5. Should we prioritise the needs of our local community, or equally demonstrate our concern for the rest of the world? Should 'charity begin at home'?
6. What could we do together as a home group to address local need? To address global need?
